Jane Frances Sullivan is a graduate of Regis College, Weston, MA where she earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology. After college Ms. Sullivan lived in Paris, France and studied French at the Alliance Francaise and received a certificate in French Language and Civilization from the University of Paris at the Sorbonne. She also earned a Master's Degree in Public Administration from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. Ms. Sullivan received her J. D. degree from the Shepard Broad College of Law, Nova Southeastern University and became a lawyer in the practice of criminal law. While at Nova, she enrolled in and completed the University of San Diego Summer Program in Law at Oxford University, Oxford, England.

As a law student, Ms. Sullivan interned for the City of Fort Lauderdale Prosecutor's Office where she prosecuted misdemeanor violations of municipal ordinances in Broward County Court.

Ms. Sullivan worked as an Assistant Public Defender for thirteen years in both County Court handling Misdemeanor cases and in Circuit Court in the Felony and Juvenile Divisions, spending eleven years in Palm Beach County and nearly two years in Volusia County. She has experience representing clients in both jury and non jury trials. She retired from the Public Defender's Office in 2012 and began a private practice.

Today she is certified by the Supreme Court of Florida as a County Court Mediator and is a volunteer with the Palm Beach County Court.

Ms. Sullivan has travelled extensively throughout the world to over twenty countries and territories, among them Australia, Azerbaijan, Armenia, China, Hong Kong, Ireland, Japan, Macau, Russia and Spain and has travelled to many US States including Alaska and Hawaii.
